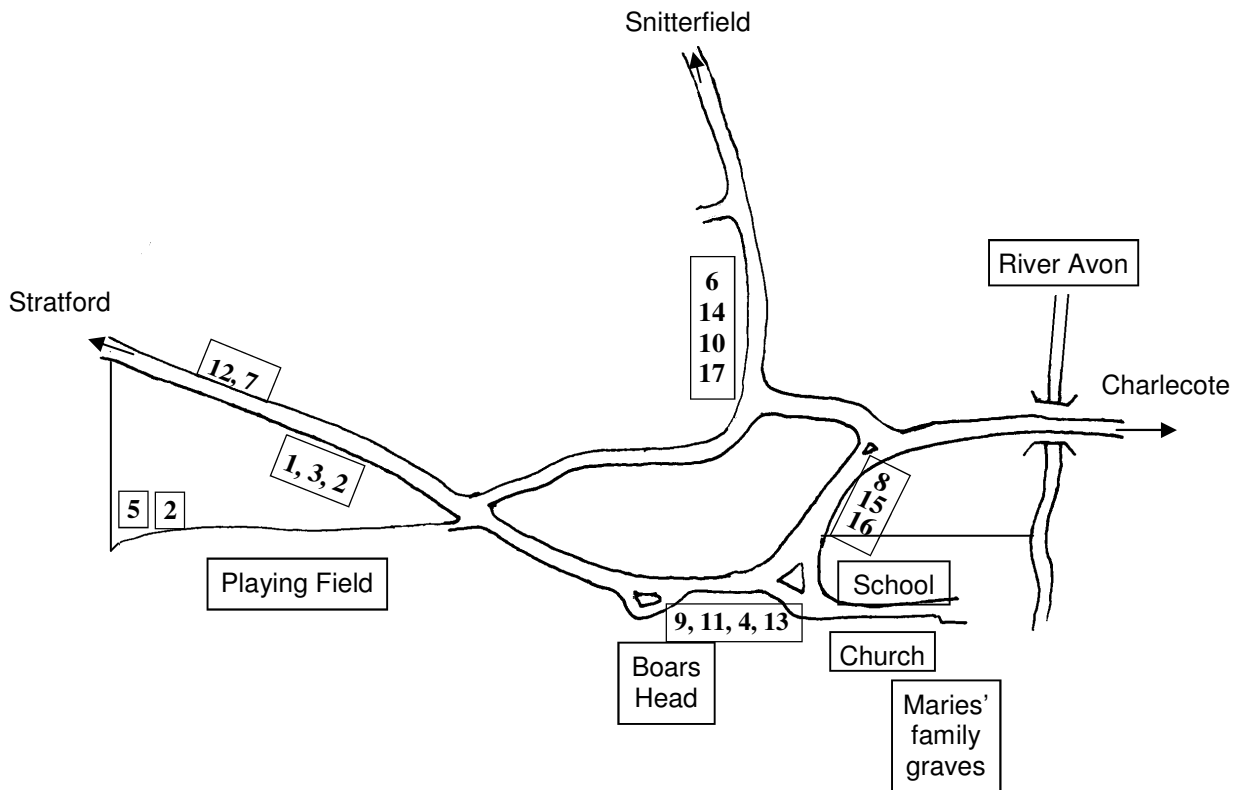


THE CHARLES MARIES TRAIL IN HAMPTON LUCY
