Riverside Permissive Paths

Defra has put up signs to show that the permissive path along the riverbank upstream of Hampton Lucy bridge has been renewed until September 2013. This is relevant to the navigation argument since the pro-navigation lobby has been arguing that the river is inaccessible. A new permissive path has also been signposted at the northern end of the Scarbank bridleway, following the contour round Copdock hill back to Sherbourne lane. PARISH LETTER



What are you worth?

And how would you find out? Financially, our value is measured in life assurance, assets and pensions. At work, your value is determined by the revenue you generate, or the cost of replacing you, or by the standard of your output. Other people often value us for what we can offer; a listening ear, a witty conversation or someone to rely on in a crisis. Prizes are awarded at school for all

sorts of achievements, and exam results can indicate academic success.

It is impossible not to be influenced by the world around us and its values. That's not always bad, but it is hard to resist the feeling that my value depends on what I do or how I behave. If I'm a nice, considerate person then people will like me. If I work hard then I might be successful. But what about the times when I'm not nice or when things go wrong? How much will I be worth then? And what do I think of others whose behaviour is way beyond what we regard as acceptable? It's hard to like unpleasant characters, or to have a good word to say about hardened and violent criminals.

But there was a man who loved not because of what a person was like, or how they behaved. Jesus made no distinction between the

successful and the failure, the religious person or the prostitute, the loving father or the adulteress, the law abiding Jew or the local 'Mafia'.

If we could begin to grasp the unconditional acceptance we are offered by God, it would be the one thing which would transform individuals and society. It would change my life and my attitude to yours. But it's hard to shake off years of conditioning to believe the words of Philip Yancey* in one of the most profound yet readable books I have come across, ever:

'There is nothing you can do to make God love you more.'

'There is nothing you can do to make God love you less.'

You can borrow my book! SE

Village Liaison Officer 2004 is an exciting new programme supported by Stratford-upon-Avon Council for Voluntary Service. It will use volunteers to assist people living in rural villages to access services and information provided by organisations such as the Local Authorities and the Voluntary Sector. These Voluntary Liaison Officers will provide a link between services, information and local people and the communities they live in and they will be supported and guided by the Rural Outreach Project Co-ordinator, Ruth Spaak. Village Liaison Officers will be invited to network meetings every other month at venues around the district to enable them to signal the requirements of their particular villages. Regular information bulletins will be sent out and guest speakers will be invited to give talks on their service areas at the network meetings. Village Liaison Officers are not expected to give specialist advice or to become involved in individual cases but they will be given packs of information about a number of services which they can pass on. Expenses for travel to meetings and telephone calls will be reimbursed by the Council for Voluntary Service.
